

Division of Aging and Adult Services (NCDAAS) are the oversight entities for the allocation and distribution of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. NCDAAS has authorized several new initiatives and the Centralina Area Agency on Aging (CAAA) will allocate the ARPA funding for eligible III-B Supportive Services for the period September 2022 - September 2024.

After submitting a Request for Funding to CAAA, Cabarrus County DHS was awarded \$165,000.00 to provide new, innovative III-B services. This funding will be used for the following services for individuals 60 years of age and older.

Chore Services - Assistance with heavy housework (including decluttering) and yardwork for individuals that are at risk for Adult Protective Services. Many times the condition of the home presents safety issues for the individual or may prevent other needs services, such as home health and home care.

The other funded services will be used is support of a new initiative - Social Isolation and Loneliness Outreach program. This initiative will provide outreach and other services to individuals that are socially isolated in the community.

These services are:

Volunteer Program Development - recruitment of volunteers for Friendly Visitor and Telephone Reassurance Programs.

Social Isolation Digital Technology Purchases - Purchase of equipment, such as tablets, to enable live social interactions from a socially isolated individual's residence.

Social Isolation Digital Training and Programming - Staff member to provide personal assistance, training, educational resources, programming and/or counseling to help socially isolated individuals learn skills or receive social/emotional support. May include training of both seniors and staff, as well as developing and monitoring the friendly visitor and telephone reassurance programs.

EASEMENT

State of North Carolina County of Cabarrus

THIS EASEMENT ("Easement") is made this _____ day of ______ 20_____, from CABARRUS COUNTY, a body politic and political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (Grantor", whether one or more), to DUKE ENERGY CAROLINAS, LLC, a North Carolina limited liability company ("Grantee").

Grantor, for and in consideration of the sum of One and 00/100 Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant unto Grantee a perpetual and non-exclusive easement, to construct, reconstruct, operate, patrol, maintain, repair, replace, relocate, add to, modify, and remove electric and communication lines including, but not limited to, all necessary supporting structures, and all other appurtenant apparatus and equipment for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy, and for technological purposes related to the operation of the electric facilities and for the communication purposes of Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers (collectively, "Facilities").

Grantor is the owner of that certain property described <u>in that instrument recorded in Deed Book 7737, Page 336,</u> Cabarrus County Register of Deeds ("**Property**").

The Facilities may be both overhead and underground and located in, upon, over, along, under, through, and across a portion of the Property within an easement area described as follows:

A strip of land thirty feet (30') in uniform width for the overhead portion of said Facilities and a strip of land twenty feet (20') in uniform width for the underground portion of said Facilities, lying equidistant on both sides of a centerline, which centerline shall be established by the center of the Facilities as installed, along with an area ten feet (10') wide on all sides of the foundation of any Grantee enclosure/transformer, vault and/or manhole, (hereinafter referred to as the "Easement Area").

For Grantee's Internal Use: Work Order #: 46200110

The rights granted herein include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Grantee shall have the right of ingress and egress over the Easement Area, Property, and any adjoining lands now owned or hereinafter acquired by Grantor (using lanes, driveways, and adjoining public roads where practical as determined by Grantee).
- 2. Grantee shall have the right to trim, cut down, and remove from the Easement Area, at any time or times and using safe and generally accepted arboricultural practices, trees, limbs, undergrowth, other vegetation, and obstructions.
- 3. Grantee shall have the right to trim, cut down, and remove from the Property, at any time or times and using safe and generally accepted arboricultural practices, dead, diseased, weak, dying, or leaning trees or limbs, which, in the opinion of Grantee, might fall upon the Easement Area or interfere with the safe and reliable operation of the Facilities.
- 4. Grantee shall have the right to install necessary guy wires and anchors extending beyond the boundaries of the Easement Area.
- 5. Grantee shall have the right to relocate the Facilities and Easement Area on the Property to conform to any future highway or street relocation, widening, or alterations.
- 6. Grantor shall not place, or permit the placement of, any structures, improvements, facilities, or obstructions, within or adjacent to the Easement Area, which may interfere with the exercise of the rights granted herein to Grantee. Grantee shall have the right to remove any such structure, improvement, facility, or obstruction at the expense of Grantor.
- 7. Excluding the removal of vegetation, structures, improvements, facilities, and obstructions as provided herein, Grantee shall promptly repair or cause to be repaired any physical damage to the surface area of the Easement Area and Property resulting from the exercise of the rights granted herein to Grantee. Such repair shall be to a condition which is reasonably close to the condition prior to the damage, and shall only be to the extent such damage was caused by Grantee or its contractors or employees.
- 8. The rights granted in this Easement include the right to install Facilities wherever needed on the Property to serve future development on the Property and neighboring lands. Portions of the Facilities may be installed immediately and other portions may be installed in the future as the need develops. Facilities installed in the future shall be installed at locations mutually agreeable to the parties hereto if they are to be located outside of the Easement Area. Upon any future installations of Facilities at mutually agreed locations, the Easement Area shall be deemed to include such future locations at the widths defined in this Easement.
- 9. All other rights and privileges reasonably necessary, in Grantee's sole discretion, for the safe, reliable, and efficient installation, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities.

The terms Grantor and Grantee shall include the respective heirs, successors, and assigns of Grantor and Grantee. The failure of Grantee to exercise or continue to exercise or enforce any of the rights herein granted shall not be construed as a waiver or abandonment of the right thereafter at any time, or from time to time, to exercise any and all such rights.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said rights, privilege, and easement unto Grantee, its successors, licensees, and assigns, forever. Grantor warrants and covenants that Grantor has the full right and authority to convey to Grantee this perpetual Easement, and that Grantee shall have quiet and peaceful possession, use and enjoyment of the same.

Revised Policy



Library Patron Conduct Policy

Article 1. Overview.

Sec. 1.1. Purpose.

The Cabarrus County Public Libraries welcome every member of the community to use and enjoy our facilities, collections, programs, and services. Because libraries are public places intended to serve people of all ages and backgrounds, this policy defines the expectations for behavior so we can provide a safe, functional, and comfortable place for all patrons and staff.

Sec. 1.2. Authority.

This policy is authorized by N.C.G.S. § 153A-263.

Article 2. Standards.

Sec. 2.1. Approved Conduct.

Patrons may only engage in activities associated with the use of a public library, including reading, studying, using library materials or services, or participating in library-sponsored programming.

Sec. 2.2. Prohibited Conduct.

Patrons may not engage in conduct that substantially interferes with the public's right of access and use of library facilities, the safety of patrons and staff, and the protection of library resources and facilities. Such prohibited conduct includes the following:

- 1. Failing to follow the instructions given by or interfering with library staff.
- 2. Using obscene or abusive language or gestures.
- 3. Harassing or unreasonably annoying others by
 - i. Engaging in noisy or boisterous activities;
 - ii. Staring at another person;
 - iii. Following another person;
 - iv. Playing audio or communications equipment (with or without headphones) so that others can hear it;
 - v. Singing or talking loudly to others or in monologues; or
 - vi. Behaving in a manner which reasonably can be expected to disturb other patrons or employees.
- 4. Engaging in sexual conduct or other lewd behavior.
- 5. Using, possessing, selling, or appearing under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
- 6. Smoking, chewing, and using other tobacco products, including vaping and electronic cigarettes and other inhalants.

- 7. Damaging, defacing, or misusing any library materials or property. This includes disabling or unplugging library equipment, changing hardware or software, using a library computer for unauthorized purposes, and vandalism.
- 8. Not wearing either (1) a shirt or other covering of a patron's upper body or (2) shoes or other footwear.
- 9. Selling any goods or services.
- 10. Soliciting, petitioning, or canvassing.
- 11. Distributing or displaying pamphlets, surveys, flyers, signs, or posters on library premises, unless approved in advance by the library.
- 12. Unhygienic conditions, behaviors, or activities that are so offensive as to
 - i. Constitute a nuisance to other persons;
 - ii. Force, or is likely to, force other patrons to leave the library; or
 - iii. Prevent, or likely to prevent, library employees from performing their duties.
- 13. Making unreasonable use of the public restrooms, including laundering clothes and bathing.
- 14. Bringing library materials or other property into restrooms.
- 15. Eating or drinking, except in designated areas.
- 16. Monopolizing library space, equipment or outlets to the exclusion of others, including by leaving items unattended for an extended period of time.
- 17. Obstructing aisles, stairways, or reading areas.
- 18. Bringing in an animal, unless it is a service animal aiding a person with a disability.
- 19. Engaging in any activity that violates federal, state, local, or other applicable law or Library policies.
- 20. Moving or rearranging furniture without prior permission from library staff.
- 21. Leaving personal property unattended without permission from library staff.

Sec. 2.3. Prohibited Items.

The following items are not permitted in the Library:

- 1. Carts, large bags, bags on wheels, backpacks, or collections of bags that are too large to store under a table and outside walking route.
- 2. Strollers when not intended for use with babies and infants.
- 3. Any personal items that appear to be infested or have a foul odor that disturbs other persons.
- 4. Bicycles or motorized vehicles. Individuals with mobility impairments are permitted to use wheelchairs, walkers, and other appropriate mobility aids on Library premises.
- 5. Non-motorized skates, skateboards, and collapsible scooters (except when carried).
- 6. Weapons of any kind, except concealed handguns carried in accordance with Cabarrus County Code § 46-4.

Sec. 2.4. Child Safety.

Cabarrus County provides a safe and welcoming environment that encourages children to visit the Library, use our collections and services, and attend programs. This is supported by the following policies:

- 1. All patrons, including those under the age of 18, must follow this conduct policy.
- 2. Library staff are not responsible for the supervision of children visiting the library.
- 3. A responsible adult must always supervise any child under the age of ten.

- 4. Adults may not use the children's area of the library, unless they are a parent or other caregiver supervising a child. Adults seeking to the children's area of a library while not supervising a child must first notify library staff.
- 5. Library staff may contact appropriate agencies if an unsupervised child appears to be truant, is left unattended when a library facility closes, or otherwise appears to be unwilling or unable to care for themselves.

Article 3. Enforcement.

Sec. 3.1. Strategy.

Library staff should take reasonable effort to respond to potentially difficult circumstances of patron behavior in a prompt, direct, and transparent fashion. Library staff must use common sense, reason, and sensitivity to resolve issues in a constructive and positive manner that avoids unnecessary escalation.

Sec. 3.2. Corrective Actions.

(a) In General. Library staff may only apply the least severe corrective action that is necessary to correct violation of this policy. While warnings and day prohibitions are preferred before resorting to more severe corrective actions, library staff may immediately impose more severe corrective actions as necessary to correct policy violations.

(b) Options.

(1) Warning.

- (A) **In General**. Any library staff member may address a violation of this policy by providing a written or verbal warning to the patron, that includes identification of the patron's violation and that further violations could result in restrictions from library access. Staff members should use warnings as an opportunity to educate patrons and consider solutions that address the patron's improper conduct in a way that minimizes disruption.
- (B) **Appeal.** A Warning is final and not subject to appeal.

(2) Day Prohibition.

- (A) **In General**. The Branch Manager, or their designee, may address a violation of this policy by prohibiting any patron from remaining at the branch for the rest of the day.
- (B) **Notice**. The Branch Manager, or their designee, may impose a Day Prohibition by providing the patron with a written or verbal notice that includes identification of the patron's violation, that the patron is no longer welcome at the branch for the remainder of the day, and contact information for the Library Director.
- (C) **Appeal**. A Day Prohibition is not subject to appeal.

(3) Short-Term Prohibition.

- (A) **In General.** The Library Director may address a violation of this policy by prohibiting a patron from entering any Cabarrus County Library for a period not exceeding 30 days.
- (B) **Notice.** The Library Director may impose a Short-Term Prohibition by providing the patron with a written notice that includes identification of the patron's

- violation, the end date of the prohibition, instructions for appealing the prohibition, and a copy of this policy.
- (C) **Appeal.** A Short-Term Prohibition may be appealed orally or in writing to the Assistant County Manager responsible for the Library.

(4) Long-Term Prohibition.

- (A) **In General**. Upon recommendation of the Library Director, the County Manager may address a violation of this policy by prohibiting a patron from entering any Cabarrus County Library for a period not exceeding one year.
- (B) Notice of Recommendation. Prior to imposing this prohibition, the Library Director must provide written notice to the patron that they are recommending a Long-Term Prohibition, the basis for the recommendation, and the process for disputing the recommendation prior to the County Manager deciding whether or not to impose a Long-Term Prohibition.
- (C) **Suspension**. The Library Director may also prohibit a patron from entering any Cabarrus County Library at the time of delivering the notice required under subparagraph (B) pending the County Manager's decision, but not to exceed 30 days.
- (D) **Process**. Prior to the County Manager deciding whether to impose a Long-Term Prohibition, the patron may offer written evidence and arguments disputing the Library Director's recommendation. The patron must have at least seven days to send such submission. The County Manager must then make the decision to impose a Long-Term Prohibition after considering the Library Director's recommendation, the patron's submissions, and any other information the County Manager finds relevant.
- (E) **Decision**. Absent good cause, the County Manager must act on the Library Director's recommendation within 30 days. The County Manager's decision must be in writing and provided to the patron without undue delay.
- (F) Early Restoration of Privileges. Not less than 90 days after the County Manager imposes a Long-Term Prohibition, a patron may send a written request to the County Manager asking that the patron have some or all library privileges restored prior to the end of the Long-Term Prohibition. After consulting with the Library Director and reviewing the patron's request, the County Manager may restore some or all of the patron's library privileges if the County Manager finds that the circumstances underlying the need for the Long-Term Prohibition have materially changed and that allowing the patron to access the library is compatible with the aims of this policy. The County Manager may set reasonable conditions and limitations on the patron's restoration of privileges and may revoke the early restoration at any time without notice or further consideration.
- (G) **Appeal**. A Long-Term Prohibition is not subject to appeal.
