Federal Shutdown Impact



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) -Federal

Food & Nutrition Services (FNS) - North Carolina

Approximately 24,000 Cabarrus County residents

\$4.1M in benefits per month

47% are 17 and under

Impact to Participants







Unless the USDA lifts the suspension before November 1st, NCDHHS is suspending the issuance of November SNAP/FNS benefits Participants can still use their EBT card at SNAP approved retailers The suspension of benefits currently does not affect the ongoing determination of eligibility of applicant households.





We will continue normal operations for application processing, including expedited service applications, and complete recertifications in compliance with federal and state policies.

NC Medicaid Rebase – Description

 NC Medicaid Rebase refers to the process North Carolina's Medicaid program uses to update the standard payment rates and budgets for healthcare providers and services.

In simple terms:

- The "rebase" recalculates how much Medicaid pays providers, based on more recent cost data, utilization patterns, and policy changes.
- It ensures payments stay aligned with current costs of care, inflation, and service delivery realities.
- Rebasing can affect hospitals, nursing homes, behavioral health providers, and managed care plans, depending on the scope.

• Example:

If hospitals' operating costs have increased since the last rebase, the new rebase may raise Medicaid reimbursement rates to reflect that.

Why Are Rates Getting Cut?

Effective **October 1, 2025**, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) is implementing across-the-board rate cuts for Medicaid provider reimbursements. Most health plans delayed implementation until **November 1, 2025**, but cuts will be retroactive.

The cuts vary by service category:

- •A **minimum** reduction of **3%** for many providers.
- •Larger cuts of 8% in certain physician/overlapping codes categories.
- •Up to **10%** reductions for high-cost categories like hospitals, nursing homes, inpatient hospital services, behavioral health, etc.

Example Categories:

- •Hospital outpatient services: 10% reduction
- Nursing facility rates: 10% reduction
- •Physician services: 8% reduction (some ER physician codes 10%)
- •Psychiatric residential treatment facilities: 10% reduction



NCDHHS: The state budget did not appropriate sufficient funds to meet projected costs ("rebase") of the Medicaid program. The cuts are within the law — since the agency must operate within the funding provided by the North Carolina General Assembly (NCGA). The cuts are reversible, if additional funding is provided.

- Navigating Changes to Medicaid & FNS



Key Changes at a Glance

Increased County Costs

The county's share of FNS administrative costs will rise from 50% to 75%, which equates to an approximate \$1.2 Million in additional county costs annually.

Higher Staff Workload

Medicaid eligibility checks are now every 6 months, doubling the review workload.

Stricter Work Requirements

Recipients must document 80 hours/month of work, service, or education.

Risk to Medicaid Expansion

A "trigger law" could endanger expansion if federal funding drops below 90%.

Major Changes Driving This:

- Work requirement age expanded to 18-64, and exemptions for veterans and others were eliminated. (This drives the 3,531 FNS number).
- Stricter rules for legally present non-citizens may disqualify them from Medicaid.

Implementation Timeline



NOVEMBER 2025: FNS Work Requirements Begin

Initial work requirements for FNS recipients start.



OCT 1, 2026: First Changes

New non-citizen rules begin. County FNS admin costs increase.



JAN 1, 2027: Major Changes

Work requirements and 6-month re-evaluations start.



OCT 1, 2027: State Cost-Sharing

NC may be required to begin funding a portion of FNS benefits.

Economic Ripple Effect

Direct Annual Loss

\$7 Million

Projected annual loss in FNS benefits (from \$588k/month due to new work requirements).

Indirect "Ripple" Loss

+ \$4.6 Million

Loss to grocers, farmers, & local businesses as those FNS dollars don't circulate in the community.


Total Community Impact

= Significant Strain

- Increased uncompensated care for hospitals.
- Financial instability for doctor's offices.
- Reduced access to behavioral health providers.
- Potential for local healthcare job losses.



Public Assistance Benefit Churn



What: The phenomenon where **eligible** individuals temporarily **lose** and then **regain** benefits (e.g., SNAP, Medicaid).

Why: Caused by administrative hurdles (like missed deadlines or verification issues), not a change in eligibility.

Impact: Leads to **hardship for recipients** and increased **administrative costs** for agencies.

Frontline Impact

Increased Caseload Complexity

Evaluating thousands of residents under new work rules requires more time, documentation, and follow-up.

Doubled Medicaid Reviews

The shift to 6-month reviews doubles the workload for the entire expansion population.

More Client Appeals

Benefit changes and denials will lead to more discussions, appeals, and time-consuming hearings.

The Financial Strain on the County

This increased workload comes with a higher direct cost as the county's share of FNS administrative costs increases by 25%.

FNS Funding Explained

Part 1: County Administrative Costs

This is the "cost of doing business" – staff salaries, office space, and operations to run the FNS program.

CURRENT 50/50 SPLIT

County (50%)

Federal (50%)

NEW 75/25 SPLIT (H.R. 1)

County (75%)

Federal (25%)

The Impact: The federal share of admin costs is cut, and the county must pay an additional \$1.2 Million annually.

Part 2: State Benefit Costs

This is the actual money for food that recipients get. This has always been 100% federally funded.

The Change (H.R. 1): The new law penalizes the State (not counties) if its Payment Error Rate (PER) is too high.

This creates the potential new cost to the state of:

\$420+ Million

The Decision: The NC Legislature must decide whether to pay this cost or opt out of the FNS program entirely.

Summary and Next Steps

Direct Resident Impact: Over 3,500 residents at risk of losing food assistance.

Economic Impact: Local economy faces a projected loss of over \$11 million annually, due to the loss of some FNS benefits.

Operational Strain: County staff face a significantly increased workload and higher costs.

Internal guiding questions for DSS:

- 1. How can we prepare our staff for the increased workload?
- 2. What community outreach strategies are needed to inform residents?
- 3. How can we collaborate with local partners to mitigate the impact?

Section II.

- A. Special appropriations to non-profit organizations shall be distributed after the execution of an agreement which ensures that all County funds are used for statutorily permissible public purposes.
- B. The County Manager or designee is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations within or between funds, or modify revenue and expenditure projections as contained herein under the following conditions:
 - Transfers amounts between objects of expenditure and revenues within a function without limitation.
 - 2. Transfer amounts up to \$500,000 between functions of the same fund.
 - 3. Transfer amounts between contingency funds which are set aside for a specific project for budgetary shortfalls or upon the appropriate approval of a change order.
 - 4. Enter and execute change orders or amendments to construction contracts in amounts less than \$90,000 when the appropriate annual budget or capital project ordinance contains sufficient appropriated but unencumbered funds.
 - 5. Award and execute contracts which are not required to be bid or which G.S. 143-131 allows to be let on informal bids so long as the annual budget or appropriate capital project ordinance contains sufficient appropriated but unencumbered funds for such purposes.
 - 6. Execute contracts with outside agencies to properly document budgeted appropriations to such agencies where G.S. 153 A-248(b), 259, 449 and any similar statutes require such contracts.
 - 7. Reject formal bids when deemed appropriate and in the best interest of Cabarrus County pursuant to G.S. 143-129(a).

Section III.

This ordinance and the budget documents shall be the basis of the financial plan for the County of Cabarrus.

- a. The Finance Director is hereby directed to maintain within the Capital Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of the law.
- b. The Finance Director is directed to report, at the request of the Board, on the financial status of each project element in Section I and on the total revenues received or claimed.
- c. Copies of this capital project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the governing Board, and to the Finance Director for direction in carrying out this project.
- d. At the completion of a construction project, all unrestricted excess funds are transferred to the Community Investment Fund or to other Capital Projects within the Capital Project Fund and the portion of the Capital Project associated with the project is closed.

Special Separation Allowance for Law Enforcement Officers

Effective July 1, 2025, <u>Session Law 2025-8 (HB 50)</u> amends G.S. 143-166.41 and G. S. 143-166.42, which governs the Law Enforcement Special Separation Allowance (LESSA) for local law enforcement officers.

As of July 1, 2025, there are two options to calculate the benefit amount and payment term. There are different eligibility criteria.

Traditional Law Enforcement Special Separation Allowance (LESSA) Benefit Option

Eligibility criteria for the traditional LESSA benefit require a law enforcement officer to satisfy the following:

- Retire under Local Governmental Employee's Retirement System; and
- Have completed thirty years of creditable service, or have attained 55 years of age or older and completed five or more years of creditable service; and
- Not have attained 62 years of age; and
- Have completed at least five years of continuous service as a law enforcement officer immediately preceding a service retirement; Any break in continuous service required by this subsection because of disability retirement or disability salary continuation benefits shall not adversely affect a qualification to receive the allowance, provided the employee returns to service within 45 days after the disability benefits cease and is otherwise qualified to receive the allowance; and
- At least fifty percent (50%) of the officer's creditable service is as a law enforcement officer.

As used in this section, "creditable service" means service for which a credit is allowed under the retirement system of which the officer is a member, provided that at least fifty percent (50%) of the service is as a law enforcement officer.

Under this option, law enforcement officers who meet these requirements are entitled to an annual benefit equal to 0.85% of their most recent annual base rate of compensation before retirement, multiplied by the officer's total years of creditable service. For example, an officer with a final salary of \$65,000 and 32 years of creditable service would receive an annual LESSA of $0.0085 \times 65,000 \times 32 = \$17,680$ (or approximately \$1,473.33 per month).

This special separation allowance ceases at the first to occur of:

- The death of the officer.
- The last day of the month in which the officer attains 62 years of age; or
- The first day of re-employment by a local government employer in any capacity. Payments will not cease when a local government employer employs a retired officer for any of the following: In a public safety position in a capacity not requiring participation in Local Governmental Employees' Retirement System; or if the officer is in service to a county board of elections on an election day or during the hours for early voting under Part 5 of Article 14A of Chapter 163 of the General Statues.)

The New 30-Year Fixed Benefit Option

For law enforcement officers who retire on or after July 1, 2025, <u>S.L. 2025-8</u> (HB 50) allows for an alternative benefit calculation.

Eligibility criteria for the new 30-year fixed benefit option require a law enforcement officer to satisfy the following:

- Retire under Local Governmental Employee's Retirement System; and
- Prior to attaining 62 years of age, the officer has completed 30 or more years of creditable service; and
- Have at least five years continuous services as a law enforcement officer immediately preceding retirement;
- Have at least 50% of total creditable service be in a law enforcement position.

Under the 30-year fixed benefit option, instead of using the officer's final salary and total years of service, the new formula fixes both variables:

- The benefit is calculated using the officer's base rate of compensation at the time they reach 30 years of creditable service; and
- The benefit is based on exactly 30 years of service, regardless of how many years the officer ultimately
 works.

The resulting annual allowance is: $0.85\% \times \text{annual}$ equivalent of base salary at 30 years \times 30. For example, if an officer's annual equivalent base salary at the 30-year mark of creditable service is \$60,000, the annual LESSA under the fixed option would be: $0.0085 \times 60,000 \times 30 = \$15,300$ per year (or \$1,275 per month).

Officers who select this option will receive this fixed monthly amount upon retirement. Unlike the traditional LESSA, the benefit under the fixed option does not automatically end at age 62. Instead, it continues until the officer has received the allowance for a period equal to the difference between age 62 and the age at which they completed 30 years of creditable service. For example, if an officer reached 30 years at age 52 and retired then, the allowance would be payable for 10 years, with payments ending at age 62. Alternatively, if the officer waited and retired at age 55, they would still receive the benefit for 10 years, with payments ending at age 65.

The benefits cease earlier if the death of an officer occurs, or the officer becomes re-employed in a position requiring participation in LGERS. (The same exception to the LGERS applies if the officer is employed by a county board of elections to work during early voting or on election day, as specified in G.S. 143-166.42(c1)(2).)

Election Requirements for Benefit Calculation

If a law enforcement officer meets all eligibility criteria under G.S. 143-166.42, the local government employer must allow the officer to elect which calculation method to use—the traditional LESSA based on final salary and total service, or the new 30-year fixed option based on the salary at 30 years. This election is a one-time, irrevocable choice that must be made before the first LESSA payment is issued. If the officer fails to make an election, then the

calculation method under the new 30-year fixed option shall be used. *Note that the new option is only available to eligible law enforcement officers who retire on or after July 1, 2025. A law enforcement officer who retired before that date may not change to the new calculation method.*

Commissary Service Amendment Kimble's Commissary Services/Cabarrus County Sheriff's Office, NC

THIS COMMISSARY SERVICE AMENDMENT ("Amendment") is by and between Cabarrus County, North Carolina ("Customer") and Kimble's Food By Design, LLC. ("Kimble's"), and amends that certain Commissary Service Agreement between the parties hereto dated July 1, 2017 ("Agreement").

- 1. Agreement. The Parties hereto agree that the Agreement is valid and binding, that there is no existing breach of any of its terms, and that it remains in full force and effect.
- Extended Term. The term of the Agreement shall be extended for an additional three (3) years, commencing July 1, 2025 ("Extended Term"). This Agreement shall continue for the duration of the Extended Term and will automatically renew for one-year terms thereafter
- 3. <u>Modification of Commissions</u>. Unless a different rate is expressly stated for specific sales or services, the Customer commission rate will be increased to 35% on inmate communication services sales (E-Mail/SMS/Picture Mail)(net of sales tax). The commission payments shall begin to accrue in the first month following the execution of this Amendment.
- Technology Grant. During the Extended Term, and any renewals thereafter, Kimble's shall pay an annual grant in the
 amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), payable on or after July 1 of each year as directed by Customer.
- 5. <u>Reference Change</u>. All references to software or to any third-party provider of software in the Agreement are rendered void and are hereby replaced by the terms and conditions detailed herein. Specifically, any references to Tech Friends, or Lockdown, or any other software related product are of no further force or effect. Nothing herein is intended to modify any reference to any telecommunications provider.
- 6. <u>Software License</u>. Kimble's shall furnish, install, maintain and update appropriate software with the Customer. Kimble's shall download the software into the Kimble's supplied equipment and on to Customer's systems. - 8. No Further Changes. Except as expressly set forth herein, there are no further changes to the terms of the Agreement.

Dear Officer Barnhardt,
I am writing to formally recommend the medical discharge of Canine Officer Nora, a 6-year, 2-month-old female Labrador Retriever currently in active service. Nora has been diagnosed with degenerative joint disease and has been experiencing acute pain episodes, as evidenced by observed vocalizations during movement.

On September 26, 2024, spinal radiographs were obtained and revealed advanced ankylosing spondylosis affecting the caudal lumbar spine, with bridging changes noted at the L4-5, L5-6, L6-7, and L7-S1 intervertebral spaces. These findings are consistent with chronic degenerative changes that are likely to continue progressing and are the probable

source of her current discomfort.

Given the severity of her condition and the impact on her mobility and quality of life, I recommended a referral to a veterinary neurologist to discuss the possibility of decompressive spinal surgery. However, even with surgical intervention, her long-term ability to meet the physical demands required of a working canine officer remains uncertain.
In light of these findings and in the interest of Nora's ongoing health and comfort, it is my professional opinion that she should be formally retired from active duty at this time.
